Greetings Mohammad,

As per our conversation this past Friday, we understand that FanVision's request for STA at Daytona, FL failed to pass the FAA slope analysis. FanVision hereby claims the shielding provision of Section 17.14(a) of the Commission's Rules for its antenna to be located at the Daytona International Speedway during the Daytona 500 auto race. FanVision's proposed antenna height of 14 meters will fall well below the height of the 7 story pressbox building, as well as the grandstands surrounding the race track. FanVision's antenna will be completely shielded by the existing surrounding, taller buildings and structures, and will pose no risk of danger to aviation in the vicinity of the race track.
