STANDARD BROADCAST STATION LICENSE  
MODIFIED AS OF JULY 26, 1967

Subject to the provisions of the Communications Act of 1934, subsequent Acts, and Treaties, and Commission Rules made thereunder, and further subject to conditions set forth in this license, 1 the LICENSEE

WCLT RADIO, INC.

is hereby authorized to use and operate the radio transmitting apparatus hereinafter described for the purpose of broad-

casting for the term beginning July 26, 1967, and ending October 1, 1967  
(3 a.m., Eastern Standard Time)

The licensee shall use and operate said apparatus only in accordance with the following terms:

- On a frequency of 1430 kc.

 Transmitter may be operated by remote control from State Route 13, near Newark, Ohio.

The apparatus herein authorized to be used and operated is located at:

and is described as follows: COLLINS, Type No. 20-V-3, Broadcasting Transmitter (or other transmitter currently listed in the Commission's "Radio Equipment List, Part B, Aural Broadcast Equipment" for the power herein authorized). Antenna: 352' (352' overall height) tapered, self-supporting, shunt excited (modified folded unipole) vertical radiator, the top-most 62 feet consisting of a six-section horizontal and six-section vertical FM Broadcast antenna. Ground system consists of 120 equally spaced, buried, copper radials 110 to 138 feet in length plus a 24 by 24 foot ground screen. Obstruction marking specifications in accordance with paragraphs 1,3,12 & 21 of FCC Form 715 attached.

The Commission reserves the right during said license period of terminating this license or making effective any changes or modification of this license which may be necessary to comply with any decision of the Commission rendered as a result of any hearing held under the rules of the Commission prior to the commencement of this license period or any decision rendered as a result of any such hearing which has been designated but not held, prior to the commencement of this license period.

This license is issued on the licensee's representation that the statements contained in licensee's application are true and that the undertakings therein contained so far as they are consistent herewith, will be carried out in good faith. The licensee shall, during the term of this license, render such broadcasting service as will serve public interest, convenience, or necessity to the full extent of the privileges herein conferred.

This license shall not vest in the licensee any right to operate the station nor any right in the use of the frequency designated in the license beyond the term hereof, nor in any other manner than authorized herein. Neither the license nor the right granted hereunder shall be assigned or otherwise transferred in violation of the Communications Act of 1934. This license is subject to the right of use or control by the Government of the United States conferred by section 606 of the Communications Act of 1934.
