On October 6, 2020, the Chair of Committee for the Assessment of Foreign Participation in the United States Telecommunications Services Sector (Committee) notified the Commission that the Committee is conducting an initial review to assess whether granting the Petition and the associated applications (see Applications Filed For The Transfer Of Control Of Conterra Ultra Broadband, LLC, Network USA, LLC, Detel Wireless, LLC, Broadplex, LLC, And Tim Ron Enterprises, LLC D/B/A Network Communications, Public Notice, DA 20-1151 (WCB/WTB/IB rel. Spt. 30, 2020)) will pose a risk to the national security or law enforcement interests of the United States, pursuant to Executive Order 13913 (85 Fed Reg 19643 (April 8, 2020)).

Pursuant to Executive Order 13913 (85 Fed Reg 19643 (April 8, 2020)), the Chair will notify the Commission when the Chair has determined that the 120-day initial review period has begun.
