Dear Ms. Dortch:

Pursuant to the above-referenced proceeding, the Federal Communications Commission (the “Commission”) granted WorldVu Satellites Limited (“OneWeb”) U.S. market access for its non-geostationary, fixed-satellite service system (the “OneWeb System”),<sup>1</sup> and, as has been reported in the press, OneWeb launched the first six satellites of the OneWeb System on February 27, 2019.<sup>2</sup> For clarity and pursuant to Section 25.261(c)(1) of the Commission’s rules,<sup>3</sup> OneWeb hereby notifies the Commission that the “first space station” in the OneWeb System has met the requirement to be “launched and capable of operating” in the bands defined in that grant.

Therefore, with respect to all mandated spectrum sharing with subsequently-launched Ku-band NGSO FSS satellite systems, OneWeb hereby claims first priority in home spectrum selection in the Ku-band.
